My husband and I own our own business. We bought the business in June of 1998. With this slow economy the last three years, we have seen a big drop in our business. The end of last year and this year, we have really seen our business decline.

Philippians 4:19 says; "And my God will supply all your needs according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus." NAS. Luke 6:38 says "Give and it will be given unto you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your laps. For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you" NIV.

I have to admit, these last couple of years I have struggled with our business situation and have wondered where God was and why He was allowing this situation in our lives. We were standing on these scriptures and we weren't seeing our business increase, instead we were seeing it steadily decline.

I am sure many of you have been affected by this slow economy as well, and maybe even the loss of your job. The only thing we knew to ask was "God what are you trying to show us"? We know that the world doesn't supply our

needs; He is our source, but it seems as if our source was not "supplying." I know, in my life, many times I have asked God, "Where are you?"

This year already has afforded me the opportunity to be at camp for eight Walks so far this year. Camp is a special place. When it seemed like I was struggling the most, there would be a Walk and off to Camp I would go, and there was God. No TV, no radio, no phone, just quiet time with God. He has always shows me something while I am there.

The last Walk I was really questioning God and where He was in our life. Saturday morning before I left for Camp, in addition to dealing with our struggling business, we realized we had a major problem with one of our water heaters, a possible leak in our pipes. Our house is on a slab, which means digging up our slab to find the leak. We had to cut off the water heater, so there was no hot water in most of the house. So off to Camp I went, questioning God all the way.

Sunday afternoon at Closing, during communion, I was going back to my seat, and we were singing a praise song to Him and there was Don, a pilgrim's sponsor, in his wheel chair totally dependent on someone else, praising God.

How humbling was that? The scripture says

It places the responsibility squarely on the shoulders of those of us who call ourselves by the name of Christ. Be the light wherever there is darkness.

Jesus is not only called the Light of the World; he said "You are the light of the world." For a long time now, the puzzle persists: What does it mean to be the light of the world? When we sing "This little light

of mine, I'm gonna let it shine," just what are we saying? Light of the world? What do we have to do to make it happen? Are we to be a moon or a mirror that merely reflects the light that comes our way? Or are we to generate light from within ourselves?

Surely Jesus did not expect of his disciples that we just become parrots, repeating only what we learn from him. Surely we are more than mere reflectors.

Essentially we are to invite Jesus into our hearts, let Jesus make us into that "new creation"

inside and out; then allow that new "you" to emanate that light. This comes from a vitality and aliveness that is your claimed likeness which is pure Jesus. And it is pure you.

They got their heads together: "This year we want a world, Gran."

Take a deep breath

This is a meditation read recently at my morning prayer group. I really like it and wanted to share it with you:

Matthew 13:31-35. The kingdom of heaven is like yeast that a woman took and mixed in with three measures of flour until all of it was leavened.

Many of Jesus' parables use images that are far from my experience. I've never found a great treasure or a wonderful pearl. I've never caught fish in a net. And where I live, mustard is a small plant that couldn't serve as a nesting place for even the smallest bird. .

But this short parable is an image I know something about, although I'm sure that when Jesus said "yeast" it was something different from the little packets of granules in my refrigerator.

If you have never made anything with yeast, I encourage you to try it. Although it may be mysterious, it isn't difficult, and it can turn out to be a kind of meditation, as one mixes the yeast into the flour, adds the milk, sugar, salt, and oil, kneads it for a while until it is smooth, and then sets it in a warm place to rise.

The dough changes from a heavy, leaden lump into something light and airy. And the smell is wonderful.

The kingdom of heaven is like yeast. Not "pie in the sky," but bread in the oven. Light, beautiful, nourishing, warm. Let's enjoy it!

We don't know what our futures hold, but we know the God who holds our future in His hands. I arrived home Sunday night to part of my house without air because a pipe had stopped up while I was at Camp, and still no hot water in most of the house, but God had shown me, a man who knew what was really important and was praising Him in spite of his situation.

Priorities, the very first talk we hear on our Walks. I had my eyes on the situations and not on Him. My prayer is that I can remember what is important (priorities) and trust in His love, mercy and grace for every situation in my life.

that what they probably wanted was a globe. Problem solved. Those kids tore into that Christmas package with all the finesse of a raging bull. Out came the present; down went their countenances.

But the thank-yous were profuse; perhaps too much.

He got them together in the den. "O.K., kids talk to me. Where did I go wrong?"

They hesitated and said, "But Gran, we wanted a lighted world."

He told later just how much he learned in that search for the lighted world. "First, a light world is harder to find. And second, a lighted world costs a lot more."

Let us say that sin is seen as darkness. Does it cost more to redeem that sinful situation or to comfortably look the other way? Is it more expensive to do something constructive about the darkness of a child's hunger or to eat sumptuously with one eye closed to that real need? What about the cost of telling the truth compared to the ease of telling that "white lie." (Whatever a white lie is.) Yes, I suppose it does cost more for a lighted world.

The Light of the World came to dwell among us, to bring light to our darkness. Remember the story? There were people lined up outside Pilate's hall just to say a resounding "No" to this light. They preferred to live in the darkness, perhaps because this was the more comfortable state.

There was a shorter line of disciples who wanted that light more than anything else. "Although everyone else turns away from you, we will still be there. I saw what was purported to be the dungeon where St. Paul was incarcerated. It was the darkest place in all of Rome. How could Paul have tolerated it? And yet, I am convinced that Paul was in the brightest hole-in-the-ground that you can imagine. Paul had allowed the Light to invade his very soul, Light that illuminated his entire being.

Well, Christian sisters and brothers, are you the light of the world? Have you invited in the Light of Christ? When we have, it lights up everything else.

When TVA was about to crank it all up, they sent word to as many people as they could. One night, in his two room house, with a wire extended from the ceiling, he was awakened with a sudden burst of light. He jumped out of his bed and ran through the country-side shouting to all who would hear: "The power is on!!! The power is on!!!! The power is on!!!!

The good news for today: The power is on!! Turn on the light!

She boldly proclaimed, "There's always hope." There is indeed, and your prayers have been answered. Sumatanga is now debt free, and utilization has picked up, though we need to continue to grow this. Thank you for your prayers, thank you for your gifts, and thank you for your faith that your prayers would be answered by continuing to schedule Emmaus Walks during our darkest hours.

Reverend Bob Murray, Camp's Executive Director for the past two and one-half years, has recently moved to his ministerial appointment at Pinson. We thank Bob for his outstanding leadership over these very difficult years, and our prayers are with him and his family.

We also welcome our new Executive

Director, Michael Coward. Michael served for four years as the Chief Operating Officer for an extremely large church (\$8 million annual budget), and also has a background in hotel and hospitality management. He comes to Camp with his wife, Hilary, and their four children. Michael has not been on an Emmaus Walk, but he has a deep faith and trust in the Lord. When you are at Camp, please stop by to say "Hello." He'll be glad to meet you.

Now that it's summer, it's time for Summer Camp. We will have about 1,500 children and youth participating in Summer Camp this year. It's such a powerful opportunity for these kids to experience the love of God. Hundreds of volunteers donate a week, or more, of their time to make Summer Camp happen. It's very similar to Emmaus where those who have participated in a Walk help others to experience that same drawing near to God.

Speaking of summer, it's hot! However, it's not in Hutto Auditorium. Thanks to a generous contribution from the Daniel Foundation, Camp replaced the HVAC

system in Hutto Auditorium this spring. The Daniel Foundation has also made a matching pledge for 2010. It will give Camp a dollar-for-dollar match for the first \$50,000 raised. Therefore, if you'd like to contribute to Camp and have your donation matched, please send your check to Camp with "Daniel Foundation" written in the memo line of the check.

Next time you're at Camp, I invite you to spend a few minutes exploring Camp's physical improvements. In the winter and spring, significant enhancements were made to five of the Pool Camp cabins. The bathrooms were re-done and air conditioning was added to the cabins! It's our plan to re-do the remaining cabins this fall and winter. Also, talk a short walk from the Lodge towards the ballpark. Tucked into the woods is a new cabin, the Hillcrest Cabin. Our long-term plans are to have 8 of such cabins in a horseshoe configuration with a building in the middle for gatherings. Each of the cabins has two separate bedrooms, each with private bath.

Yes, indeed, prayers were answered. As 1 Chronicles 5:20 says, "He answered their prayers because they trusted in him."
